HO CHI MINH CITY TOUR FULL DAY

MORNING

8:45 AM: depart for a visit to HoChiMinh City's oldest pagoda - Giac Lam Pagoda - built in the 17th century. Then visiting Chinatown, Binh Tay Market (Cho Lon), see the locals bartering, purchasing and selling wares. We also stop off at the Thien Hau Lady Temple that was built in the early 19th Century dedicated to Thien Hau, the Goddess of seafarers. The bus takes us along the Saigon Riverside to overview Nha Rong wharf, where Ho Chi Minh first left Vietnam in 1911.

AFTERNOON

O2:15 PM: visits the **War Remnants Museum** – originally opened in September 1975, it displays old military equipment and other related items from the Anti-American War. We continue to visit the **Reunification Palace**, formerly known as the Presidential Palace that was the sight of South Vietnam's surrender in April 1975. Walk down to see **Notre Dame Cathedral** and **General Post Office** which are beautiful examples of architecture from the French colonial period. **05:00 PM**: drop




